Schoolmoney - payment system...

Yesterday, you should have received a text from school with information about our new online payment system called **Schoolmoney**. This will allow parents and carers to pay for items online using their credit or debit cards – just like you would with any other online purchases e.g. Amazon. This is a very safe, secure way to pay for school items e.g. Swimming, school trips etc.

Please follow the link on the text sent to you.

To request a payment, we will send you a text (and/or email), you will then login to your Schoolmoney account. Here you will be able to view any payments pending. If you are having difficulties logging in to your account for the first time, we advise you to try the following:

- 1. Please make sure that you are not using capital letters when logging in (all lower case letters);
- 2. Only the first name is used e.g. katie;
- 3. Make sure that school has your most up-to-date mobile number and email; and
- 4. Some parents have multiple email addresses try all email addresses
- 5. Try an alternative device e.g. laptop or tablet

In the near future, we use this system to book and pay for school dinners – this will also give you menu choices for each day.

We hope you will find this new service a convenient way to book and pay for school related activities.

How to raise a concern in school...

At intervals throughout the school year, we like to remind and advise parents as to how they may raise a concern. At all times, we aim to resolve matters swiftly and in a supportive, amicable manner.

At Ashgrove Primary School we value parents and carers as partners in the education of our pupils. The views of parents are significant and we encourage the positive contributions which parents and carers make to the life of our school.

We recognise that from time to time, a parent or carer may have a concern about some aspect of their child's life at school. By working in partnership with home, it is the school's aim that any concern is dealt with quickly and efficiently.

Please find below the procedure we have in place.

As a school we will deal with any concern in courteous and professional manner as the needs of our pupils are paramount.

HOW DO I RAISE A CONCERN?

1. Make an appointment with the class teacher to discuss the matter. We strongly advocate making an appointment as otherwise this impinges on teaching and preparation time. (Making an appointment will enable the teacher to give you the necessary time to listen to your concern).

Most often concerns can be resolved at this stage.

- 2. If after speaking to the teacher the matter is not resolved the issue can be taken up with the Head of Key Stage or the Vice Principal.
- 3. Following the second step, if concerns still remain the issue can be referred to the Princip
- 4. Ultimately if the issue is still not resolved the parents/carers can write to the Chairperson of the Complaints Committee of Board of Governors (Mr B. Edwards)- please refer to our Complaints Procedure.

It is very rare for concerns not to be resolved before stage 4.
