

BASELINE ASSESSMENTS

At the beginning of each term, pupils complete a short set of exercises to help Doodle build them a personalised work programme. Baseline Assessments should be completed at school. Doodle will automatically target each child's learning gaps and consolidate their knowledge, ensuring progression through the curriculum.









Don't worry if your child's level of working comes out lower than the level they've been working at. This could mean:




- Your child needs to revisit and reinforce some areas of learning.
- Your child has been receiving help to complete tasks and therefore the previous working level was not a true reflection of independent learning and ability.









































Due to differences in the English and Northern Irish curriculum, children should aim to secure the objectives two years below the year group they are in and entering the year group below. E.g. At the end of P6, children should've secured Year 4's objectives and be starting on Year 5's.





INDEPENDENCE









It can be extremely difficult to not assist as tasks are being completed but we have found that those who receive help at home really struggle when working on Doodle in class.





LITTLE AND OFTEN

Try to build Doodle into your child's daily routine. Pupils should aim for approximately 10 minutes per day. This has a much better impact than working for 30 minutes one day a week.














Revarding Doodle Achievements



DOODLEMATHS

Every Friday morning, the class with the highest percentage of children in their green zone receives our Doodle Maths trophy.



STREAKS

A streak is the number of days, in a row, a child has used Doodle Maths. This includes weekends and holidays. Every Tuesday afternoon, Numeracy Leader certificates are completed for giving out at assemblies on Wednesday and Thursday. If pupils don't earn any stars on Monday night then I can't see their streak. Certificates are given for the following streaks: 25, 50, 100, 150, 200, 250, 300, 365, 400, 500 and so on in increments of 100.



Children also need to be in their green zone.


Streaks can be broken if Tricky Questions are solely worked on as no stars will be earned. Ensure a daily exercise is completed. Please note, if children break their streak, they won't be given repeat certificates.





DOODLETABLES

For P4 – P7 classes, every Friday morning, the class with the highest percentage of children in their green zone, in their respective groups, receives a piece of their class robot. When a class completes its robot, they receive a smaller robot and are able to have 10 minutes extra break time.
