### Our School Code of Conduct.

At the beginning of a new school year it is important we share and remind all pupils, parents and staff of our Code of Conduct. These are simple quidelines and expectations from school to ensure all our pupils are safe, happy and can make good progress with their learning. Please take some time to read our Code of Conduct and talk about this with your child/children at home.

It is very important that all children arrive to school on time in the morning. Pupils may enter the school grounds from 8.40 am and must be in school for 8.55 am when the bell rings. Pupils who are LATE should go to the main entrance Reception. For safeguarding reasons parents should not escort late pupils to the classrooms.

Being punctual to school is very important and I ask for parents full co-operation on this matter.

#### Morning Supervision

Over the past couple of weeks there have been a number of children who persistently arrive to school before **8.40 am** and are left unsupervised in school grounds; this is compromising the safety of these pupils. Please be aware it is the responsibility of parents to ensure the supervision of their child/children until 8.40 am.

Children arriving to school early may go to our **Breakfast Club** which starts at 8.00 am. Breakfast is available for only £1.50 per day, alternatively if only supervision is required this costs just £1.00. Children arriving to school before 8.40 am should make their way to the Breakfast Club via the P3/5 gate.

#### School Attendance HIGH IMPROTANCE

It is very important that our pupils attend school every day. Each day absent from school represents a day of lost learning. We understand that occasionally a child may be ill and not able to attend school — this should be rare. Each month we closely monitor the attendance of all children. **If attendance falls below 85%** we will draw your attention to this matter. If your child is off school, please ring and leave a message to explain the absence and follow this up with a written explanation on the child's return to school.

#### School Carpark

Parents and visitors to school are welcome to use the Carpark facilities in our grounds. However, it is up to all adults to ensure the safety and care of our pupils and indeed other adults. For this reason, we ask everyone to adhere to the following:

- Speed limit of **5 MPH** (should be strictly adhered to)
- Vehicles should not be parked on pavements or access points at any time
- All drivers must observe the one-way system
- Drivers must exercise extreme caution at all times when in school grounds
- Pedestrians should use the designated crossing areas & pathways
- Parents should get out of their car to collect their child and escort them to their vehicle or in to school (pupil safety comes first!)
- The disabled bays at the front of school should only be used by blue badge holders
- Please show consideration for other drivers and remember the safety of our pupils is paramount

Please share this information with everyone at home who may be collecting or leaving pupils to school.
