As some parents are no doubt aware we have a number of mobile classrooms in school... although these have served us well for many years they are in need of replacement. A proposal has been put forward through the School Enhancement Programme for Ashgrove Primary to benefit from a major extension costing approximately £3m. While the proposal looks favourable, and has been costed by the Education Authority, we need our MLA's to formally approve such a major expenditure.

With the lack of a functioning Assembly in Stormont, I ask our parents to lobby your MLA to keep the interests of Ashgrove Primary at the fore to allow our school to push forward with this enhancement programme.

This is wonderful news; a very welcome development for our school and will ensure we can continue to provide the highest standard of education for many more years to come.

Maths Week...

This year, we will be participating in Maths Week for the first time. The children will be participating in activities based on using different codes to unravel messages. This will require them to work systematically to be successful – a vital process within Numeracy.

P1 – P4 will be completing a Treasure Hunt. They will follow picture cues to various stations. At each station, they will need to answer a mathematical question. Each answer will correspond with a letter which they will use to find the punch line to my extremely funny jokes.

P5 – P7 will have a different type of coding system to use each day to discover messages. They will also have a homework challenge where they will need to work out how a code works and solve two messages — they may need some guidance with this. Estimation skills will be put to the test to guess the number of sweets in the jar. All children throughout the school will have a guess — no money is required.

P6 and P7 will be tuning into a live maths show, broadcast by Living Maths, on Tuesday at 11:30am. This will be an interactive maths show where 8 schools in Ireland will be active participants in a Maths Show that will feature schools from all across the world using Google Hangouts. Skoolbo App

As part of Maths Week next week, we will be using a new App in School called Skoolbo. This App is free and lots of fun whilst providing revision, practice and new learning in a game format. The children will create their own avatar and fly through 3D worlds answering lots of questions and gaining rewards.

As a School we do not advocate prolonged periods of screen time but we feel this App will benefit your child and consolidate learning in addition to the many creative Apps that will enhance their personal thinking skills. * Next week, your child will receive a Skoolbo log in card with their personal log in details. You can then download the App on an Apple or Android device and this will link to our school account which will help us compete against the other 50,000 schools who are successfully using this app. Don't worry if you can't download the App to your device/ laptop as you can still play online in your browser at www.Skoolbo.co.uk.

Although this App plays both Numeracy and Literacy games and even Languages we will be having a class competition next week to see which classes answer the most questions and hopefully we will appear on the national leaderboard too.

Please be aware that this is an online game and will use data if used on a phone rather than a WiFi network.
