After School Club Provision survey...

Thank you to those of you who took the time to share your thoughts and insight into your usage of our After School Club provision. This information will be invaluable in planning and delivering improvements in this area.

For your information, a summary of the outcomes are below...

- 1. As a parent or carer, would you like our After School Club provision to be extended to a later time? **YES- 97%**
- 2. If available, to which time would you use our After School Club provision?4.00 pm 6%5.00 pm 61%6.00 pm 27%
- Our After School Club costs £2.50 per hour, do you think this is reasonable value for childcare?
 Yes- 78%
 NO- 1.5%
 It should cost less- 17%
 It should cost more- 3%
- 4. Is booking our After School Club online via SchoolMoney a convenient way for you to book? **YES- 95.5**%

As a result of this consultation, it is now planned to extend our After School Club provision after Halloween. I will write to you with more information in the coming weeks.



Parent Teacher Consultations

Our Parent Teacher Interviews are due to be held in school on **Monday 22nd**, **Tuesday 23rd and Wednesday 24th October.** (As a reminder, all children will go home at the earlier time of 12.30 pm after lunches have been served).

By now, you should have received an email (and or text) inviting you to select a date and time to attend a Consultation with your child(s) teacher. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the progress your child is making in school. It is also a good opportunity to share information from home. Thank you to those of you who have promptly selected an interview date and time.

If you have yet to select your interview time I strongly encourage you to do so as soon as possible as interviews are allocated on a first come, first served basis. I hope you have found this system a convenient way to book your Consultation.

I remind parents that there will be NO TEACHER LED after school activities the week commencing Monday 22nd October.

School Carpark

Parents and visitors to school are welcome to use the Carpark facilities in our grounds. However, it is up to all adults to ensure the safety and care of our pupils and indeed other adults. For this reason, we ask everyone to adhere to the following:

- Speed limit of **5 MPH** (should be strictly observed)
- Vehicles should not be parked on pavements or access points at any time
- All drivers must observe the one-way system
- Drivers must exercise extreme caution at all times when in school grounds
- Pedestrians should use the designated crossing areas & pathways
- Parents should get out of their car to collect their child and escort them to their vehicle or in to school (pupil safety comes first!)
- The disabled bays at the front of school should only be used by blue badge holders
- Please show consideration for other drivers and remember the safety of our pupils is paramount

Please share this information with everyone at home who may be collecting or leaving pupils to school.
