PRIMARY 1 APPLICATIONS FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

The EA online portal for Primary 1 applications for September 2020 is now live — to make an application simply click on the link on the homepage of our website or go directly to the EA website. The application process itself is straightforward. There has been a very heavy demand on the EA website over the past few days and some parents have experienced difficulty with the website. However, do not worry as you have until the end of January to apply for your school place. As a reminder, you must bring a copy of your child's **BIRTH CERTIFICATE** to us by **FRIDAY 7th**

AQE & GL Results and P7 Transfer Procedure

P7 AQE results will be posted to the first named contact on your registration form and delivered to your home address on **Saturday 25**th **January.** Primary schools are not informed of the results before this date.

Transfer Interviews with Mr Smith will take place during the week beginning **Monday 27**th **January**.

General Information and Guidance

- Transfer Forms are sent by the Education Authority to primary school principals for completion by parents.
- Completed Transfer Forms should be returned to the EA by primary schools by Wednesday 5th February 2020.
- The Transfer Form is a very important document. It will contain all the information which your chosen post-primary schools will use to consider your child's application. (When the time comes to complete the form you will receive from your primary school a set of guidance notes to help you).
- You should list <u>at least 4 schools</u> on the Transfer Form. You can list as many school as you wish, but if you do not list at least 4 schools the possibility of your child not being admitted to a school of your preference is increased.
- You will NOT be asked for further preferences during the process so it is very important that you list all schools on the Transfer Form which you would like your child to be considered for.
- You should not enter the same school more than once. Preferences for schools located in another Education Authority region can be listed in your child's Transfer Form.
- You and you alone are responsible for ensuring that all relevant information is provided.
- That if you do not provide relevant information you may reduce the chance of your child being admitted to a school of your preference.
- That it is also your responsibility to ensure that the information you provide is correct.
- Your form will be passed to the school named as a first preference so that it can apply its
 admissions criteria based on the information provided. The form may need to be passed to other
 schools named as preferences before the process is complete.
- A letter will be posted to you by the Education Authority on **Saturday 30th May** to tell you the outcome of your application. This **Placement Letter** will tell you the post-primary school in which your child has been placed. Schools are not permitted to tell you the outcome before this date.





ATTENDANCE REMINDERS...

At the beginning of a new year it is timely to remind all parents and guardians of the importance of high levels of attendance. Excellent attendance and a punctual start to the school day are important to all children and the smooth running of our school.

Poor attendance has an impact on pupil relationships, friendships and academic achievement.

The Department of Education has shared the guide on absence below...

100% Attendance	0 days missed	Excellent
95-99% Attendance	See above for details	Very Good- Good
95% Attendance	9 days of absence 1 week and 4 days of learning missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 days of absence 3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 days of absence 5 weeks and 3 days of learning lost	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 days of absence 7 weeks and 3 days of learning missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 days of absence 9 weeks and 1 day of learning	Unacceptable

As a reminder, our school routines are as follows:

- Pupils may enter the school from **8.40 am** at this time members of staff are on duty and can ensure appropriate supervision.
- The school day starts at **8.55 am** we expect all children to be in class at this time.
- ANY CHILD ARRIVING TO SCHOOL AFTER 8.55 AM IS LATE.
- A child arriving to school after 8.55 am will need to come to the main school entrance. Parents are welcome to escort their child to the Reception area. The Secretary will give the child access to the school building.
- Pupils who are late in to school are expected to walk by themselves to their classroom.

If your child is absent from school, please inform us on the **FIRST DAY** of absence by leaving a message with the Office. On the return of your child to school, you should follow this up with a brief explanatory note — we are required to record a reason for all absences.
