"Governments must oversee the process of adoption and make sue it is safe, lawful and that it priorities the children's best interests. Children should only be adopted outside of their country if they cannot be placed with a family in their own country."

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WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD IS ILL?

Recently in school, there have been bouts if illness including Chicken Pox and flu. If your child is diagnosed with an illness, which means they cannot come to school, please inform us by ringing the Office on the first morning they will be absent and selecting the option to explain an absence. We ask all parents follow this up with a brief explanatory note when the child returns to school.

PERIOD DIGNITY

The Department of Education is rolling out to all schools – both primary and post primary information and support on a scheme called Period Dignity. In school we have children who mature at different rates and some girls start their periods as young as 7 or 8 years old. As a Rights Respecting School we want to support all our learners in a caring and respectful way.

Part of the Period Dignity Scheme is to provide free sanitary products to people who need them, these will be available in the school. Mrs Luney will act as the Period Dignity Key Contact. We will consult with you in the weeks ahead on Period Dignity Policy.

CREATE A SAFE PROFILE

Even though somebody would need your child's phone number to add them as a contact, as an extra security measure we suggest altering their profile settings to control who can see their profile photoein of status. The options to choose from are there profile photoeants's and Nobody. We suggest selecting My Contacts' or 'Nobody' to ensure their profile is protected.

EXPLAIN HOW TO BLOCK PEOPLE

If your child has received ipam or offensive mersages, calls or attachments from a contact, they should block them. Messages and status updates sent by a blocked contact will not show up on the phone and will stay undelivered. Blocking someone will not remove this contact from the contact list they will need to be removed from the phone's address book. To block a contact, your child needs to open the person's chat stream and REPORT SCAM MESSAGES

DELETE ACCIDENTAL MESSAGES

If your child has sent a message to the wrong chat or if a message they sent has contained a mistake, they can delete it. To do this, simply tap and hold on the message, choose 'Delete' and then 'Delete for everyone.' The app allows seven minutes to delete the message after it has been sent, but it is important to remember that recipients may have seen and screenshot message before it was delated.

SET TIME LIMITS
