RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOLS ARTICLE 21 (ADOPTION)

"Governments must oversee the process of adoption and make sure it is safe, lawful and that it priorities the children's best interests. Children should only be adopted outside of their country if they cannot be placed with a family in their own country."

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD IS ILL?

Recently in school, there have been bouts if illness including Chicken Pox and flu. If your child is diagnosed with an illness, which means they cannot come to school, please inform us by ringing the Office on the first morning they will be absent and selecting the option to explain an absence. We ask all parents follow this up with a brief explanatory note when the child returns to school.

Whooping Cough	5 days absence from onset of rash	
Scarlet Fever	5 days absence from onset of rash	
Diarrhea/ Vomiting	Until symptoms have settled for 24 hours	
Headlice	None (treatment required)


