Rights Respecting Schools

Article 25 (review of treatment in care)

"If a child has been placed away from home for the purpose of care or protection (for example with a foster family or in hospital) they have the right to a regular review of their treatment, the way they are cared for and their wider circumstances."

In school, we work closely with may outside agencies to support and care for children who have been placed away from home.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL REMINDERS (SAFEGUARDING)

Occasionally, children may need medication in school, this may either be for a short term or longer term condition.

It is essential we are aware if any child requires medication during the school day. For Health & Safety reasons we are unable to administer medication unless the appropriate written consent and request form is completed. These online forms can be easily accessed on our website. Following the submission of a request to administer medication, or for a child to carry his or her medication, the request must be approved by the Principal.

Please note, we can only administer medication according to medical instructions and medication must be brought to school in the original packaging/container. It is the responsibility of legal guardians to ensure that all medication in school in date.

PRIMARY 7 POST PRIMARY PLACEMENT NOTIFICATIONS

P7 children who are due to start their post primary schools in September will find out the outcome of their applications on **Saturday 18th May**. Parents will be notified of the outcome via the EA Application Portal and parents will receive an email to their nominated email address on the morning of 18.05.23. (Post Primary Schools may also write to you by post).

Depending on the outcome of the application procedure, parents will receive one of three emails:

- 1. Child is selected by the school of first preference;
- 2. Child is selected by a school which is not the first preference;
- 3. Child is not yet placed in a school.

Signposting within each email will guide parents to sources of support if needed. Please note, most Post Primary Schools do not require confirmation of acceptance of a school place. If any post primary schools require this, they will contact you directly with instructions on how to respond. Parents will be advised that the offer of a school place may be subject to providing verifying information, again if this is the case, the post primary school will contact you with guidance

If your child has not yet been placed, the EA will write to you on the same date and you will be asked to list further preferences from a list of schools which still have places remaining.
